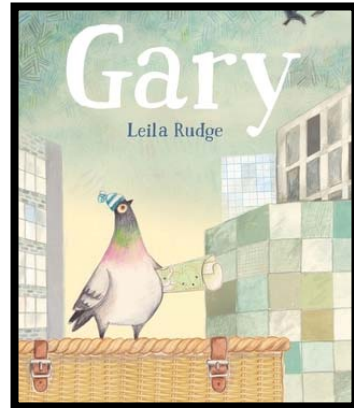
# Emus
